Pennsylvania jobless rate fell; payrolls, labor force up

Pennsylvania's payrolls and workforce grew in April as the state's unemployment rate sank to a post-pandemic low, according to new state figures released Friday. Pennsylvania's unemployment rate dropped one-tenth of a percentage point to 4.8% from March's rate, the state Department of Labor and Industry said. The national rate was 3.6% in April. The gap between Pennsylvania's unemployment rate and the national rate is among the widest it has been in decades. In a survey of households, the labor force grew by 23,000 to pass 6.4 million, as the number of employed grew by 28,000 to farther above 6 million and the number of unemployed fell by 5,000 to 308,000.

The state's labor force fell after hitting a record high of almost 6.6 million just before the COVID-19 pandemic hit, and still remains below 2008's levels. In a separate survey of employers, nonfarm payrolls in Pennsylvania grew in April by 11,400, driven primarily by hiring in manufacturing, leisure and hospitality and the education and health services sectors. At just above 5.9 million, payrolls are at their highest point since hitting a record high of nearly 6.1 million just before the pandemic, according to state figures.

(Limited) East Coast Fuel Supply is in the News Again

A year after the Colonial Pipeline was shut for a week following a ransomware attack, the East Coast is again seeing an extreme pinch in available full supply. Fuel markets along the Eastern Seaboard have been disrupted since the start of European hostilities and the subsequent global ban on the purchase of Russian products. The East Coast refining base, centered around the Philadelphia area, has been halved in the last ten years, as poor economics has led to multiple plant closures. Gulf Coast refineries are running at very high rates and can ship production along the Pipeline, but market timing and stronger global demand for diesel fuel is pulling non-contracted diesel supply away from East Coast cities. Bloomberg recently reported that East Coast diesel fuel stockpiles are at their lowest level since 1990.

What is the ERTC & Does Your Business Qualify?

The Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC) is a refundable tax credit that employers can claim upon meeting certain criteria. The credit is claimed on qualifying wages and healthcare costs. The criteria for eligibility is a full or partial suspension of the operation of their trade or business during any calendar quarter because of governmental orders limiting commerce, travel or group meetings due to COVID-19 in 2020 and 2021, or a significant decline in gross receipts. An eligible employer's ability to claim the Employee Retention Credit is impacted by other credit and relief provisions. For more information and to see if you may qualify, contact Mike








Community Foundation Accepting Summer Community Grant Applications for Nonprofits and Public Schools

Community Foundation Accepting Summer Community Grant Applications for Nonprofits and Public Schools Grants are available from the following funds. Community Grant Fund projects may include (but are not limited to) any one or more of the following broad priorities:

- Arts, Culture, & Humanities
- Children, Youth, & Families
- Community & Economic Development
- Education
- Environment
- Food & Hunger
- Health & Fitness
- Human Services

Grant awards for Community grants will not exceed \$3,000.



Cindy's Wind Fund for Women & Girls will provide one grant of \$500 to projects which help women and girls fulfill their potential. The Cindy's Wind Fund seeks proposals for projects that aim to help women and girls fulfill their full potential, which may include activities such as information programs, direct service programs, special activities, professional development for women and girls.

Consol Energy Excellence in Education Fund will provide up to eight grants of \$250-500 for teacher-led classroom projects that fall outside the normal school budget, or that the teacher would otherwise use their own funds to support. Grants are available to public school teachers.
