



The winner of this prestigious award will be selected from nominations received by the Chamber. Nominees are judged on contributions to community welfare and betterment; participation in community activities and civic enterprises; lasting contributions to community welfare; leadership abilities; success in their individual vocations; personal progress; and cooperation with other individuals and organizations. The awards will be presented for direct, outstanding service to the community and has no association to the Chamber of Commerce involvement.

Employers Applaud Action to Expand Jobs in PA

Job creators are taking note of the bipartisan action taken to attract new employment opportunities and residents to Pennsylvania. The Pennsylvania Chamber of Commerce, business operators and others discussed the changes this week at a gathering in Lancaster.

One of the most significant steps they cited is the phase-down of the job-killing, corporate net income tax (CNIT). Under a provision of the new state budget, the rate will drop to 8.99% in 2023, and then continue to drop until it hits 4.99% in 2031. Once the reduction is fully implemented, Pennsylvania will go from imposing one of the nation's highest CNIT rates to the eighth lowest in the country. The consensus is that this will make Pennsylvania highly competitive among neighboring states in the northeast and others across the U.S. Other changes made to the state's tax code will be very helpful for mom-and-pop businesses. More than 99% of Pennsylvania businesses are small businesses, and those 1.1 million small businesses employ 2.5 million people, which is 46.3% of all Pennsylvania employees.

Under the new law, Pennsylvania will recognize "like-kind" exchanges for state tax deferral when property is exchanged for similar property. Federal tax law already allows for the tax deferral on federal taxes, providing some incentive for employers to invest in the job-creating assets businesses need to remain competitive, but Pennsylvania had been the only state not to recognize these exchanges for state tax purposes.

State tax law governing expense deductions is also being changed to bring it in line with federal law, eliminating the unequal treatment of Pennsylvania's small businesses. The increase in limits will make it easier for employers to buy equipment and to invest, which promotes job growth. Pennsylvanians need employment opportunities if they are to stay and raise families here. It's exciting to hear job creators applauding the steps we've taken to increase the number of good-paying jobs that support healthy, thriving communities.

University to offer new major in Business Administration and Professional Studies Program for Degree Completion

Waynesburg University will offer new programs in the Department of Business Administration and Graduate and Professional Studies this upcoming fall 2022 semester. These programs include a new Bachelor of Science in Business Administration concentration and an associate's degree in Professional Studies.

The Department of Business Administration has added a Hospitality Management Program to its curriculum that will focus on the various aspects of hospitality operations.

Students who major in hospitality management will study the vast scope of ventures within the service-based industry, where they will grow their skills in customer service and become familiar with everything from payment processing systems to contingency planning for natural disasters and event security.

The Hospitality Management Program will prepare students for managerial positions in a diverse range of establishments, including amusement parks, airlines, convention centers, country clubs, cruise ships, hotels and restaurants.

An associate's degree in Professional Studies will now be offered within Waynesburg's Graduate and Professional Studies. In alignment with the University's existing Online Bachelor's Degree Completion Program, the Professional Studies Program will provide another pathway to students for degree completion.

Students can complete their degree with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science in Professional Studies based on courses taken within or transferred into the program. Coursework for this degree will be offered every five weeks and can be completed fully online.

"Waynesburg University is committed to creating pathways for our students to accomplish their education and career goals," said Dr. David Mariner, dean of Graduate and Professional Studies. "We have developed 100% online bachelor's degree completion pathways as well as an associate's degree pathway to better meet the needs of our students." The Graduate and Professional Studies Counseling Programs also recently announced the addition of a new Certificate in Clinical Supervision Program, which will launch in January 2023. This 12-credit, non-degree certificate will be available 100% asynchronous online and can be completed in as little as two semesters.
