

On Wednesday, April 10th, "it came to me with a lot of prayer" stated Dave Calvario, Director of the Community Foundation of Greene County. For approximately 18 months, Dave worked alongside Mark Krupa and Dan Wagoner of the GCCTC to carry out this county wide effort to bring our communities and school districts together to ultimately impact work force development.

The evening commenced by a welcome from GCCTC director Mark Krupa, followed by words from Dave Calvario, GCCTC Culinary Arts Teacher Dan Wagner, student Ellie Turner, and student Dylan Wilson. Following the speakers, those businesses and individuals who provided financial support to the project were recognized. RURAL ACCESS MOBILITY PLATFORM

A SUPPLEMENTARY TRANSPORTATION RESEARCH PROJECT IN GREENE COUNTY

On-demand Ride Sharing Program Launched in Greene County

The Rural County Mobility Platform (RAMP), a pilot program testing the concept of on-demand shared mobility in rural areas, launched in Greene County Wednesday, May 1. Managed by Blueprints and developed by Carnegie Mellon University, the program offers free, on-demand transportation in Greene County for essential services including healthcare, work, grocery shopping and conducting government-related business for a four-month period. To request a ride, residents should call 724-780-RAMP (7267) or visit ramp-pilot.com.

"Transportation is critical to so many aspects of life; in rural counties, where true public transportation is unavailable, there is a limit to where people can work, shop, access healthcare or seek opportunities to thrive," said Blueprints Chief Executive Officer Jeff Fondelier.

Available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., the program operates with three Honda Odyssey vans, marked with signage, including RAMP logo car magnets on the side doors and window clings in the front and back windows. One van operates on a regular fixed-route service between Waynesburg and Carmichaels, while the other two vans offer on-demand service throughout the county.

"The Greene County Commissioners are very excited to participate in this pilot program to connect our residents with needed services," said Jared Edgreen, Chairman on the Board of Commissioners for Greene County.

The goal of RAMP is to improve mobility in rural Southwestern Pennsylvania, with the potential to advance the fundamental knowledge of how energy-efficient, affordable mobility services can work in rural America, enabling them to be systematically planned, operated, and monitored, inherently merged with system-level modeling.

"We are thrilled to be collaborating with our partners to deploy our research to solve real-world problems by addressing rural citizens' mobility needs for enhanced quality of life, while taking into account energy efficiency and sustainability," said Karen Lightman, Executive Director of Safety21, US DOT National University Transportation Center at Carnegie Mellon University.

Blueprints, Waynesburg University, and the County of Greene were named subrecipients of a grant from the U.S. Department of Energy to Carnegie Mellon University's Mobility Data Analytics Center for the RAMP project. "Mobility service solutions readily broaden transportation choices and improve equity in urban environments. However, many rural areas, making up the majority of our U.S. land area, lack alternative mobility solutions. The RAMP project is an exciting implementation of technology and community partnerships that will inform rural communities across the country in efficient and cost-effective transportation solutions," said Nicole Kirby, Technology Integration Project Officer for the National Energy Technology Laboratory.

The routes are designed according to the results of a 2022 survey of more than 600 Greene County residents and complement existing public transportation options.

Ridership and participation in this program is critical for collecting data that may help quantify how this temporary system is having an impact and exploring potential for seeking long-term financial support to continue its operations.
