Last year we raised \$50,086 to provide daily emergency services to Greene County lowincome clients who come to the Center and need help with food, rent, mortgage, utilities, clothes, medicine, or overnight lodging.

To achieve this, we need the help of volunteers to man our kettles through the 2024 Holiday season.

We are asking for your help this kettle year and that you select a contact person to schedule dates and times

Shifts are usually 2 people for 2 hours from 10am-7pm.

The locations are Waynesburg Walmart, Waynesburg Giant Eagle, Waynesburg Big Lots. Carmichaels Shop N Save, and Jefferson Giant Eagle.

Also, we will have available tabletop kettles for Businesses, churches, and organizations

We will campaign from Friday, November 29 to Friday, December 24th on any day during the week

Normally we bell ring on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, although we would love to ring everyday

You are a blessing to the people of Greene County and The Salvation Army Greene County Service Center!

Thank YOU for your continued support and generous donation each month for the programs and services of the Salvation Army-Greene County.

Because of generous donors like you, we can assist Greene County families with overdue utility bills (to stop disconnect) assist with heating fuel (to keep warm), lodging- (to avoid being homeless), food (to avoid food insecurity) and to continue support to our local fire fighter, police, and emergency services workers responding to emergencies (fire, flood, etc.) within the county with our Centers Emergency Disaster Services- (EDS -Canteen truck).

So far in 2024, in our free warehouse, we have given out over 18,000 items of clothing, shoes, household items, toys, books, and pieces of furniture.

We were able to send flood kits to our local townships during the heavy rains and floods, brought our EDS canteen truck to a few disasters within the county to support the emergency responders, and so far in 2024, we have helped feed over 1000 individuals, helped stop disconnection of utilities for 400 individuals, helped with heating fuel to 200 individuals, and 33 Greene County kids were excited to pick out a new gift for their birthdays.

Expected to help over 400 Angel Tree recipients this Christmas time and assisted over 600 children with back-to-school clothes, shoes in August as well as expected 80 for Project Bundle Up.

In times of need people know they can rely on The Salvation Army because of the help we receive from community members like yourself.

Compassionate donors, like you, enable us to carry on our ministry.



The Evolving Workplace: Viewing Changes Positively

The modern work environment is evolving at a remarkable pace. There are countless ways that the workplace today differs from that of just five years ago and it's unlikely that the pace of change will slow anytime soon. For many people, changes in the workplace can create stress and discomfort as they are pushed to vacate long-held norms and practices and attempt new ways of working and interacting with fellow employees and company leaders.

But change is good, and in fact, it is essential to virtually all aspects of business life. Typically, companies that modify their practices to adapt to change open the doors to creative opportunities and often thrive, while those that fail to adapt to these changes can stagnate or even fail. Many of these groups are commanding a greater sphere of influence and power. As a result, employers are offering enhanced health benefits, flexible work-from-home arrangements and racial, gender and pay equity. Employers have recognized that creating an inclusive culture is important to the success of their company and its long-term growth and profitability, since today's employees are quick to begin searching for new employment if they feel their needs are not being met.
- Changes in Government... Whether on a local or national level, changes in government invariably involves a shift in political agenda, which often times impacts how businesses operate. In obvious terms, this can refer to compliance issues, but employers need to also look carefully for indirect and more subtle impacts as well.

In short, employers should view change as good. Today's workplace demands constant attention to changing dynamics, but the reward for adaptation to needed changes often means the difference between success and failure.


