## Unique PA Program Celebrating Business!

If you haven't heard, there is a truly unique and wonderful program that has been operating in Pennsylvania for the past thirty-five years designed to teach our high school students why "free enterprise" is key to the American way of life. Pennsylvania Free Enterprise Week (PFEW), internationallyacclaimed for its excellence, will graduate more than 2,000 students this coming summer with a vastly improved understanding about how free markets operate and what the challenges are that face all American companies, particularly those located in Pennsylvania.

Each summer, PFEW holds five, one-week individual sessions in July and August. The focus of the week is to group the participants (strangers at first) into "management teams" of senior executives who have inherited imaginary "companies." These teams, under the guiding hands of an "executives-on-loan," called Company Advisors, operate their firms for a computer-simulated three-year period of time. To add a sense of reality, they are competing against two other student "companies" manufacturing and distributing the same product. Each day's activities include four to five presentations from world-class business people from a list that reads like who's who in Pennsylvania. The students hear about: Business and Finance, the Role and Relationship of Business

and Government, Taxation, Business Ethics, Labor Relations, and much, much more. Is it effective? Said Sarah Minor from Coudersport Area Junior/Senior High School in Potter County, "I can tell you honestly that this was one of the most incredible opportunities that any young man or woman could ever possibly dream of having! PFEW not only promises amazing speakers and an amazing experience, it delivers on all of its promises 100%! It really was an indescribable honor to be a part of PFEW and I recommend it to any teenager, even if they aren't interested in business. I will carry these memories forever!"

Every student attends PFEW on a fully tax-deductible \$525 scholarship (the actual value of the scholarship exceeds \$1,500) which is provided by a local firm. PFEW is also an approved organization through the PA Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program through the Department of Community and Economic Development.

#### **Direct Results Owner Honored**



### SRMC to Host Open House

Every day you hear about some change as the healthcare industry adjusts to the Affordable Care Act environment. Every hospital, physician and clinic is finding a way to define or redefine their role in this new system. For Southwest Regional Medical Center, it means focusing on core strengths and ensuring quality access to healthcare for the community it serves.

The past several months have been full of changes for Southwest Regional Medical Center and on February 28 from noon – two pm, the community is invited to come and see of the positive outcomes of these changes.

SRMC recently completed renovations thanks to the Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program matching grant program. The renovation has redefined the facility to allow for all private rooms. Although every patient will have their own room, patients will not be charged more for this level of care. Each room on the third floor, including the medical surgical and intermediate care unit, has been updated with fresh paint, new flooring, wireless internet access and new Isogel air support mattresses.

Under the renovation, SRMC's emergency department, staffed by board certified physicians, has also received an update with new paint, wider doorways and other changes, which will enhance the flow for the entire department. The emergency department has grown from serving approximately 12,000 patients in 2005 to approximately 24,000 today. The facility also now boasts a website and phone app, which provides real time average wait times from door to physician. The website is called SRMCfastER.com and can be saved to the screen of a smart phone for ease of access. The hospital outperforms in many state and national indicators regarding emergency department wait times.

The open house celebration will showcase the latest improvement and will be held during Heart Month on February 28. The event will also offer the opportunity for visitors to meet staff, physicians and SRMC board members. Tours will be offered and lunch will be provided. A chocolate display will cap off the event. Attendees will also have a chance to enter into a drawing to win dinner for 2 at the Lodge at Rohanna's and a 1 hour massage.

### Film Features Greene County Talent

The cast and community involved in the creation of the new children's film, "For His Own Glory," gathered on Tuesday, December 17, 2013, at Greene Community Church to enjoy a first look at the newly produced project.

The film, which teaches ASL sign language to describe 12 barnyard animals (cow, horse, dog, cat, sheep, pig, goat, rabbit, duck, chicken, rooster, donkey), features children and farm animals of Greene County, PA.


"We're especially happy to be able to showcase the faces, farms and talent of those right here in our region," says David Crowe of Crowe's Nest Media. "More than 95% of the DVD was completed with Greene County talent, from the children used to demonstrate the signing to the music and even the farm-themed finger puppets."

This talent includes local musicians Frank & Lisa Pazzynski; Hannah Morris, an accomplished pianist and communication major at Waynesburg University; and Sandy Seybold, a "crafter-extraordinaire." The 40-minute educational film teaches everything from sign language to number, letter, and animal sound recognition—all the while teaching children of the "glory of God," and "pointing to God as the Creator," according to David.

A family affair, the new project is the third film for the Crowe family of Crowe's Nest Media, who also reside in Greene County. Hosted by Grace Crowe, 9, animated by Samuel Crowe, 14, and edited by Taylor Crowe, 16, the project was produced and directed by parents, David & Kellie Crowe.

The Crowe's say they created this film as a result of not finding what they were looking for when searching for a DVD to teach early sign-language to their youngest son, Andrew. "We wanted a video that would teach sign-language, but that would also be God-honoring," says Crowe.

According to the website description, "For His Own Glory" is "fun, gentle, playful" and provides a great opportunity to "snuggle with your little ones, all the while teaching them about the wonderful Creator God." In addition to including six hymn



classics, the project also features the music of Judy Rogers, a national Christian recording artist.
