WAYNESBURG UNIVERSITY

Waynesburg University opened a new residence hall on Monday, August 4, 2008. It is located on the corner of Washington and Franklin Streets on the campus of Waynesburg University.

"The University is looking forward to having students move into the new residence hall," said Senior Vice President for Finance and Administration, Roy Barnhart. "The additional housing provides the University with the means necessary for growth.

The new six floor facility will house 140 male upperclassmen. Similar to the rooms in Pollock Hall, the University's residence hall that was built in 2004, there will be a sofa and a micro-fridge in each room. The rooms are approximately 20 feet by 20 feet, each

with a private bathroom and independent climate control.

The building is also equipped with two elevators, a study lounge, full kitchen, laundry and a conference room.

"The new residence hall is a representation of the landmark increase in enrollment over the past three years," said Sarah Zwinger, Director of Admissions at Waynesburg University. "The new residence hall will allow students to experience the convenience of apartment-style housing."



White Covered Bridge Festival

As the summer starts to wind down, you may be sitting at home wondering about what to do with your time. On September 20th and 21st from 10 AM to 5 PM, the 38th Annual Covered Bridge Festival of Washington and



Greene counties will be taking place at the White Covered Bridge. The White Covered Bridge is located near Garards Fort, in Greene Township. The festival will be celebrated at ten of the twenty-one Covered Bridges in the two counties. The White Covered Bridge, which is currently being re-furbished in hopes of the bridge lasting another ninety years, has a special opening ceremony being planned.

In addition to seeing the bridges, there will be many different crafters, who create things such as fabric items, painted crafts, PVC pipe bird houses, wood crafts and toys, pottery, and fruits and vegetables. Demonstrations will be taking place as well, with such things

as antique tools, lace tatting, quilting, glass etching, and more. On both days there will be Civil War Re-Enactors, from the 140th Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, and the 31st Virginia Infantry (Barbour Grays), and others, which will be having a living history as well as a "battle". There will also be a children's activity area, with many different fun things geared specifically for the children to enjoy. And finally, what is a festival without food! There will be seven local church groups and two Volunteer Fire Departments, each with different food so that there are a wide variety of choices for everyone in attendance.


