GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

President John Owen called the meeting to order at 12:15 pm. He welcomed everyone and asked for introductions around the room. On a motion by Jack McCracken, seconded by Dick Robinson, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written. On motion by Dick Robinson and seconded by Pauline Crumrine, the Treasurer's report was approved. On a motion by Clark Patterson and seconded by Shirley Stockdale, the Secretary's report was approved.

CCMMITTEE REPORTS: Pauline Crumrine reported on the Hospitality Committee stating the committee was developing a general directory with a revised map; this information should be finalized by next Tuesday (3/29). She also stated they are still considering a "big brother big sister" list that employees of the prison can contact for various suggestions i.e., recreation, doctors, restaurants. Any one wishing to become a part of that list should contact Patty at the Chamber office. John Owen reported that the Rain Day Pageant committee has met and decided the pageant will be on July 24th this year, beginning at 6:00 pm at the high school auditorium and the age has be changed to 14 to 18. Mr. Painter reviewed several drawings of the proposed school with the membership and answered several questions. And one question of course was how much will this escalate our taxes and answering he stated four mills with a total cost of the project being 17.5 million dollars beginning January 1996. Even with the 4 mill increase, Central Greene will still remain next to the lowest in millage.

ADJOURNMENT: On a motion made by Jack McCracken and seconded by Kay Laskody, the meeting was adjourned at 1:15 p.m.
