President Mary K. Pruss called the meeting to order. On a motion by Gloria Richter, seconded by Richard Scott, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written. On a motion by Andrew Corfont, seconded by Millie Wonderling, the Secretary's Report was approved as presented. On a motion by Ruth Enci, seconded by Shirley Stockdale, the Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.

Old Business: Mary Pruss reviewed that the Greene County Food Bank will sponsor the March to End Hunger on Saturday, March 26 beginning at the Waynesburg Armory. Our local Pizza Hut held a fund raiser which benefited the food bank also and they raised \$110.00 for the March to End Hunger. Ruth Enci mentioned that food bank can double the value of the food items when they buy food.

New Business: The Greene County Commissioners have requested input from the Chamber Board and from it's members, regarding the current County Visitors Guide. They are planning a new guide and would like some direction before they proceed. All members present were encouraged to write a short comment to the commissioners by the

end of the month. The date has been set for Greene County Clean Up Day for April 24'th from 9 a.m. to 12 noon. All business owners were encouraged to clean up around their own business on that day to show support of the project. Also, volunteers are needed to help with the core group which will focus on Nemacolin this year.

President Mary K. Pruss introduced Pauline Crumrine of Nova Care, Inc.. Nova Care was formally known as Health Trax Rehabilitation. They purchased the old Gatlings store and introduced "Aquatics" with the addition of an indoor pool. They are staffed by John Klein, Therapist, Nicole Voyter and Mark Lesako, Athletic Trainer. Their hours of operation are Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Patients are referred by a physician to the facility for rehab. "Aqua Therapy" is the lowest impact type of exercise and patients work in the pool up to three times a week. A tour was given of the Nautilus Machines, Free Weights, Aerobic Exercise Equipment and of course the Pool. The exercise equipment is available for use by the general public at a cost of \$25.00 per month. Lunch was provided by Nova Care, Inc. in cooperation with Pizza Hut with salad, sandwiches, and drinks.

On a motion by Shirley Stockdale, seconded by Jim Porter, the meeting was adjourned.

Waynesburg College Received Campus Compact Grant

The College was awarded a \$2500 grant from Campus Compact, through a grant from the Ford Foundation, to document its service-learning activities and community-based partnering initiatives. Dr. Jerry Wood, Vice President for Student Services submitted the proposal.

"This grant will help us better understand the broader dimension of an engaged campus," says Wood. "Our community partnerships will create opportunities for faculty members, students, and community leaders to meet, combine our resources, and address real problems facing this region."

Waynesburg is one of ten colleges and universities nationwide to receive funding.


