#### Director's Note

As many of you are now aware, our local Pennsylvania Army National Guard members have been called up for service in Kosovo. This means that local employees, fathers, husbands, sons and friends will be leaving the area to support Operation Enduring Freedom. What this can mean to family left behind is a disruption of their normal lives. Something as mundane as mowing the lawn can present a huge problem to a wife left behind with small children to tend to. If the car won't start or the sink begins to leak, the family needs someone to turn to for help. With that in mind, the Family Readiness Group (F.R.G.), being lead by Deanna and Shane Cole, will become the lifesaver for many of these families. What can the Chamber members do to help these families while their loved ones are keeping the peace in Kosovo? Chamber members and other area businesses are currently being sought to join a list of businesses who will offer their services to the families of our soldiers at a discounted rate. The list will be kept updated by the Chamber and presented to the F.R.G. regularly while the soldiers are deployed. If a family encounters a problem, the F.R.G. will be contacted and the list will be consulted. If a local business is offering the service needed, the business will be contacted by the F.R.G. and final arrangement made to assist the family in need. This effort will afford many of the soldiers some peace of mind while they are away, enabling them to rest assured that someone back home is looking out for their families. In addition, items will be accepted that could be placed into care packages and sent to the soldiers as a reminder of home. For instance, magazines, phonecards, candy, etc. make welcome additions to these packages. Postage to ship the packages is also needed. # "The Accidentals" To Perform At Celebrating The Arts



#### PFEW Celebrates 25th Year!



An exciting one-of-a-kind program open to area students will be celebrating a quarter century of quality educational opportunities for Pennsylvania youth this summer. That program, Pennsylvania Free Enterprise Week, (PFEW) is completely funded, taught and staffed by practitioners from the Pennsylvania business and industry community.

With all of the economic doom and gloom lately, PFEW has taken on even greater significance. Said John Trombetta, president of the Foundation for Free Enterprise Education that presents PFEW each year, "I have never seen young peoples' attitudes worse about business or business people than I did with the entering class of 2002 last summer. The misdeeds of a few corrupt corporate officials over the past year has been over reported in the media and led to widespread mistrust and cynicism about business. Fortunately, PFEW can completely transform those attitudes after a young person spends seven days with some of Pennsylvania's outstanding business men and women."

What John says is proven by the statistics of the 2002 PFEW graduates. Of the more than 1,400 who attended, 98.5% said that the program gave them a better and positive understanding of the American free enterprise system; 97% said that what they learned would benefit their lives; 95% reported that PFEW changed their perception about business and a whopping 99.2% reported that their sponsors money had been well invested in their scholarship.

PFEW now runs four individual sessions in July and August. Each participant is assigned to be a member of a "management team" operating a computer simulated "company" for the equivalent of three years during which time they make all the decisions any real life business person does. Adding reality to the experience, each student team is competing against other student "companies" manufacturing and distributing the same product. The teams decide how much to produce, where to sell it, what to charge for it and must deal with all the same issues that any business does in today's highly competi-

tive global marketplace. Speakers, who read like a "who's who" in Pennsylvania business, talk to them about: international trade, the role and relationship of business and government, labor issues, the quality movement, business ethics, and more. The whole focus of PFEW is to acquaint young people with the challenges facing American business, and Pennsylvania business in particular, as well as to educate them about their role as a consumer and member of the workforce.

The Chamber is proud to support PFEW and encourages local companies to provide sponsorship for our students. Each young person attends PFEW on a \$350 fully tax deductible scholarship provided by a local company or civic organization. Companies are recognized and thanked in a variety of ways for their sponsorship and the students wear their sponsor's name and correspond with them following the program. PFEW is also approved for the Educational Tax Credit program through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development.

It's not just about the scholarships, however, as PFEW is completely taught by business volunteers. #### Direct E-mail To Employers Promotes Use Of PA CareerLink

Over 250,000 human resource directors, business executives and business owners in the state. received a personal e-mail from Gov. Mark Schweiker late last fall encouraging them to use PA CareerLink to find qualified employees. The primary goal of the campaign was to raise awareness of PA CareerLink and build credibility among employers. The opt-in e-mail lists that were used cast a wide net among prospective targets to help PA CareerLink users. The top two performing lists were well above industry standards for response rates and officials found that those lists targeting human resources directors were most effective. A secondary goal of the e-mail campaign was to drive employers to the PA CareerLink web site (at www.state.pa.us; PA keyword: jobs) to enroll and use the system.

The results: over 4,500 businesses clicked through from the e-mail to the employer services page of the website. And PA CareerLink officials reported that from October 31 to Nov. 17, 2002, nearly 217,000 viewed the special "You Seek. We Find. PA CareerLink" graphic on the home page.






