


forming connections through love, providing a space for growth, and uplifting through education."

### Waynesburg University Announces Military and Veteran Focused Scholarship

Waynesburg University is proud to announce a new scholarship initiative, the Saluting Faithful Service Scholarship, in honor and support of those who have served our country. This \$500 scholarship is open to active-duty military personnel, members of the National Guard and Reserves, and veterans with an honorable discharge.



"This scholarship is a wonderful opportunity to better serve our military and veteran community while celebrating the mission of Waynesburg University and its traditions of faith, service and learning," said Dr. Michelle Steimer, director of veteran and military student services.

One scholarship will be awarded every fall semester and one every spring semester and can be applied towards enrollment in the University's Online Degree Completion Program, undergraduate or graduate coursework. Interested individuals should visit <a href="waynesburg.edu/saluting-faithful-service">waynesburg.edu/saluting-faithful-service</a> to apply and submit their materials.

To be eligible for the Saluting Faithful Service Scholarship, applicants must:

- Be a current military member actively serving in active duty, the National Guard or Reserves, or a veteran possessing an honorable discharge
- Provide proof of military service (service will be verified using an applicant's DD-214 prior to the scholarship being conferred)
- Submit a one-to-two-page essay describing how their faith informed their service to the country.

The deadline to apply is Friday, Jan. 31, 2025. Required documentation must be completed and submitted by the deadline for consideration. Recipient selection will be decided by Sunday, Feb. 15, 2025.

## Introducing Pennsylvania's New Employer Tax Credit



### For Employer Matching Contributions to Employee ABLE Accounts

A new employer tax credit will encourage Pennsylvania employers to contribute to their employees' ABLE accounts.

Beginning in January 2025, Pennsylvania employers will be eligible to claim a 25% state tax credit against the aggregate amount of all matching contributions to employee ABLE accounts of up to \$500 per employee per tax year.

PA ABLE accounts provide people with disabilities the opportunity for greater control of their finances and to plan a more secure future without impacting eligibility for important benefits.

Example: In the tax year 2025, an employer makes matching contributions of \$500 per PA ABLE account for 10 employees. The employer's tax credit will be 25% of \$5,000, or \$1,250.

### Become a More Attractive Place to Work by Helping Employees Save

Research shows that over 80% of employees who want this type of savings program would participate if offered by their employer.

## Introducing Pennsylvania's New Employer Tax Credit



For Employer Matching Contributions to Employee 529 Accounts

A new employer tax credit will encourage Pennsylvania employers to contribute to their employees' 529 accounts.

Beginning in January 2025, Pennsylvania employers will be eligible to claim a 25% state tax credit against the aggregate amount of all matching contributions to employee 529 accounts of up to \$500 per employee per tax year.

PA 529 plans help families save for future educational expenses at qualifying technical, collegiate and apprenticeship programs.

Example: In the tax year 2025, an employer makes matching contributions of \$500 per PA 529 account for 10 employees. The employer's tax credit will be 25% of \$5,000, or \$1,250.
