

GREENE COUNTY UNITED WAY REACHES 89% OF GOAL

Greene County United Way Campaign Chair Sherri Falor announced that United Way has reached 89% or \$223,852, of its 2002 campaign goal of \$250,000. Some of the revenue generated for this year's campaign came from the annual kick-off event, Radio Day, sponsored by WANB. Local businesses provide their own DJ's, callers vote for their favorite at \$1.00 per vote. This year's Radio Day raise \$4,854, the highest amount since the event began fourteen years

ago. Another campaign activity for 2002 was a benefit dance held at the Waynesburg Elk's Club. The performance was by the oldies band, "One Shy." In conjunction with the campaign kick-off each year, Greene County United Way also sponsors a volunteer program called Day of Caring. Volunteers from throughout the county meet on a Saturday and help senior citizens with small household chores. This year there were 72 volunteers who helped 37 seniors. For the 2002 Campaign, volunteers put together a special prize package with gifts donated by local merchants. An annual donation of \$25 qualifies the contributor for the "Let's Eat" category, which includes food related items. For \$30, a donor is eligible for the "Fitness and Entertainment" package, and for \$50, you are eligible for the grand prize included in the "On the Go" category, a 1997 Subaru Impreza from John Howard, CPJD. WCCC NAMED CISCO REGIONAL NETWORKING ACADEMY

Cisco Systems Inc., a major supplier of telecommunications equipment for the Internet, recently appointed Westmoreland County Community College as a Regional Networking Academy for Cisco training. WCCC has partnered with Cisco since August 2001 to serve as a Local Networking Academy, offering coursework to prepare students to take the Cisco Certified Network Associate (CCNA) examination. Currently 75 WCCC students are enrolled in telecommunications classes and the first class is expected to graduate in May. school students who successfully complete Cisco Networking Academy courses as juniors and seniors could receive up to 20 credits of advanced standing for the associate degree in Computer Technology-Telecommunications at WCCC. The program includes a series of wide area networking classes offered in partnership with Cisco, along with classes in operating systems, telephony, fiber optics and wireless communications. GREENE COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION OPEN HOUSE A SUCCESS

In celebration of Community Foundation Week, an open house was held at the Greene County Community Foundation (CFGF) headquarters in downtown. Community foundations provide grants to local non-profits activities such as the arts, education, environmental projects, health and disaster relief. CFGF began with seed money from three private foundations, including the Benedum Foundation, which also provided money to hire an executive director. John W. McCall, has been selected as CFGF's first executive director. CFGF currently holds over \$700,00



in assets from nine funds that are Agency Endowments or Donor Advised Funds. Three regional foundations have also committed \$625,000 in pass through grants to CFGF for community and economic development in Greene County. The CFGF accepts gifts on various sizes and types from private citizens, local corporation, other foundations, and government agencies. 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

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
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
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
