



Pennsylvania's Outstanding Oldest Worker Award

The annual search for the Pennsylvania's Outstanding Oldest Worker and America's Oldest Worker is about to begin. Currently the committee is looking for prize donors. Suzanne Huffman reported that the Revitalization Committee will be holding a Town Meeting tomorrow night beginning at 5 p.m. at the Theater. The plan for the evening will be to unveil the Main Street USA Program and Glenn Toothman's Memory Medallions. The evening will be hosted by a mystery emcee and everyone is welcome. A special thanks to Laurel Bank for allowing us to put a window display in as well as the High Street merchants for allowing us to fly balloons from their establishments this past week. Robyn Riggs reported that the Kick-Off for the Miss Rain Day Pageant is scheduled for this evening at Waynesburg College. Sixteen candidates and their mothers will attend. Donations to the scholarship pageant have been coming in from members and their support is appreciated. The candidates will be taken to Kennywood on July 10th which also happens to be Greene County Day and members were urged to visit Kennywood on that day.

OLD BUSINESS: Suzanne Huffman reviewed the Greene County Day at Kennywood and announced that tickets are on sale in our office. They are scheduled to attend their first meeting to learn about the program and will report back at a later date.

Sheila Barger, Chair of the Educational Scholarship Fund introduced the winner of the 2000 Scholarship. Miss Jessica Lemley was chosen from twenty-two entries. Jessica introduced her parents and thanked the Chamber for the award. She presented a brief speech about her life and life goals and then read her winning essay to the membership.
