

#### REV. DR. DAVID L. BARRETT RECEIVES DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

On Saturday, November 6th the Waynesburg Elks Club was transformed into an elegant dining hall with flowers and candlelight. Rev. Dr. David L. Barrett was presented with the Chamber's Distinguished Service Award in the presence of his family and friends. He was presented with the award by President, Mary Pruss who reviewed a few of his many accomplishments. Susan Stoy from Representative H. William DeWeese's office, who also nominated him for the award, presented him with a special citation. A special citation was also presented by Pam Snyder from Congressman Frank Mascara's Office and one was received from State Senator Barry Stout.

Rev. Dr. David C. Barrett was born in 1935 and raised in Edgewater, N.J., the son of Harold III and Erma Barrett, he was the middle of six children.

He graduated from Dwight Morrow High School in Englewood, N.J. and was employed for three years with the ALCOA Aluminum Company after graduating. In 1955, he enlisted in the U.S. Army, and it was there that he first received the calling of God.

After serving in the Army, he earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in History from Barrington College in 1961. He entered Pittsburgh Theological Seminary and received a Master of Divinity degree from the institution in 1964.

During his years at Barrington College, he met Carole Nichols of Bay Shore, N.J. who was also attending the college. One year later, in December 1958, they were married. He was ordained to the ministry in the Presbyterian Church on June 21, 1964.

From 1964 to 1967, he served as assistant pastor at Hebron United Presbyterian Church in Penn Hills. From 1967 to 1970, he served as pastor of Reed Memorial United Presbyterian Church Lyndhurst, N.J. From 1970 to 1975 he served as associate pastor at Beverly Heights Presbyterian Church in Mt. Lebanon. In June of 1975, he accepted the position of pastor at the First Presbyterian Church of Waynesburg, where he has remained since.

In 1989, he received a doctor of divinity degree from Waynesburg College. He is a past president of the Waynesburg Ministertum, and has served on the following boards: Chairman of the Salvation Army Waynesburg Service Unit for 15 years. American Red Cross, American Cancer Society, Try Again

Homes, Habitat for Humanity and Greene County Association for Retarded Citizens.

In the Presbytery of Washington, he has served on the Evangelism Committee, Committee on Ministry, Personnel Committee, Committee of Preparation for Ministry and on the Synod Evangelism Committee in New Jersey.

He has been involved in numerous committees for crusades and rallies. He has participated in various community charities and fund raisers, and has spent much of his time visiting sick and elderly members of the community.

In addition to the numerous missionaries and religious dignitaries that he has welcomed into the church over the past 24 years, the church has traveled extensively in hopes of strengthening its relationship with God. Over the course of the past 20 years, he and several other congregation members, as well as representatives of other community churches, have traveled overseas to various locations, including Jerusalem and Russia.

He plans to retire in June 2000, after 36 years in the ministry and 26 years in Greene County, as pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Waynesburg.

He and Carole have three children Amy, David, Jr. and Stephen; and two grandchildren, Melissa and James David. Living with Dave and Carole at home is their niece, Robin McGill and Dave's older brother Harold.
