



The mission of AEI is to provide funding and information services and build key partnerships in an effort to support arts, academic and extracurricular programs that benefit public school children in Central Appalachia. What began as AEI's sole focus has become one of the organization's three branches of service. This funding branch, dedicated exclusively to funding arts education programming, does not fund individual or "discrete" arts education programs, but rather it funds the expansion of existing, successful arts education programs - often those operated by local or regional arts organizations - to new audiences. In other words, programs that are currently unavailable to or geographically inconvenient for a given population of teachers and students are made available, through AEI funding, to those in "economically distressed" areas of Central Appalachia. AEI funds the expansion of arts enrichment programs for students as well as professional development workshops in the arts for teachers to equip both arts teachers and general classroom teachers with the information and resources to provide a well-rounded, creative education for all students. AEI provides the administrative work required to organize the expansion as well as funding for all aspects of the expanded program. Through this funding branch, AEI is helping to ensure that every child in Central Appalachia receives an education that includes a creative outlet. # Member Wins Writeidea Competition

Two clients of the Institute for Entrepreneurial Excellence (IEE) at the University of Pittsburgh Joseph M. Katz Graduate School of Business were recognized for their innovative businesses in the WriteIdea Business Plan Competition. The contest, which is sponsored annually by Seton Hill University's National Education Center for Women in Business on behalf of the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development and the Appalachian Regional Commission, works to encourage economic development through the growth of women-owned enterprises in Greene, Washington, Fayette and Westmoreland Counties.



Rebecca Walawander of Greene County won for her proposal for The Design & Copy Center that opened in July. Walawander's business combines her skills as a graphic designer with her entrepreneurial instincts and offers many services including lamination, wedding invitations, announcements, greeting cards, manuals, cookbooks, and brochures and calendars. Walawander will split a cash prize of \$25,000 with winners from the other counties.

WriteIdea entries were reviewed by a panel of judges representing Fayette, Greene, Wash-

ington and Westmoreland Counties who evaluated each entry for innovation, employment capability, a management plan, high growth potential and overall viability. Finalists were invited to Seton Hill University's Education Center for Women in Business to make presentation in support of their plan and interview with the judges.

The competition was open to women-owned businesses that are at least 51% owned by a woman with a maximum sales volume of \$100,000. A winner was selected from each of the four designated counties. In addition to the cash prize, Walawander and the other winners will receive technical resources to ensure success and continued operation of her business in Southwestern Pennsylvania.


"Women-owned businesses have been a major contributor in improving the economic climate of the entire Southwestern Pennsylvania region," Dugan, Executive Director of the Institute for Entrepreneurial Excellence, said. "Our Clients embody the American spirit of entrepreneurship and in turn have improved the quality of life in their communities."

Jeanine Henry, a consultant with the IEE's Greene County Office, counseled the two women. Her work with entrepreneurs is part of the commitment of the Small Business Development Center at the IEE commitment to enabling economic development in our region.






