Mary Pruss called the meeting to order at 12:15 p.m. On a motion by Richard Scott, seconded by Jeanine Henry, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved. On a motion by Richard Scott, seconded by Suzanne Huffman the Secretaries report was approved. On a motion by Suzanne Huffman, seconded by Millie Wonderling, the Treasurer's Report was approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Mary Pruss reported on the Annual Banquet and DSA Award in the absence of committee chair, Robyn Riggs. Robyn's father passed away earlier this week and she was unable to attend. The event is planned for November 6th at the Elks with a dinner mystery being performed by the Greene Theater Company. Mary reminded everyone that nominations are due to the office by the end of September so the selection committee can review the nominations. Suzanne Huffman, chair of the Downtown Revitalization Committee reported that committee meets tomorrow at noon at Groovy's to review the results of the survey. She will share those results with the General Membership at the October meeting.

OLD BUSINESS: Members were encouraged to contact the office and offer to help sell the Christmas Bulbs which feature Miller Hall. The bulbs sold well this past weekend at the Covered Bridge Festival. Melody Longstreth will be selling from a booth at Arts in the Park this coming weekend and Jenny Nicholson will be selling at the Harvest Festival in October. Mary Pruss encouraged members who attend those events to stop by the booth for a half an hour or so and give the staff a break.

NEW BUSINESS: Mary Pruss asked for a volunteer to fill the position of Bowlby Library representative and attend two meetings a year at the Library. Chad Moore is no longer able to fill that position and has asked for a replacement. If no one comes forward within one week, the President will appoint someone to the position. Mary also asked for five members interested in serving on the nominating committee for the Board of Directors. Their responsibility would be to find ten candidates for the election which is to be held in November. If no one comes forward within one week, the President will appoint a committee.

Mary introduced Jeff Rodgers with Greene County Children & Youth Services. He began by giving an overview of the C.Y.S. department which currently uses 12 caseworkers in the county to oversee and average of 58 children each month who are in foster care. A sad fact is that 15% of all the children living in Greene County will be aided by C.Y.S. this year. They are seeing a 12% annual increase in the number of children they aid each year. In 1998, 1,500 children were a part of their services and 95 of those cases involved sexual or physical abuse. A common misconception is that C.Y.S. takes the child away from the parent in those cases, but in reality, it is the judge or a law enforcement officer who removes a child from a situation that is threatening. C.Y.S. is there to place the child and move on their behalf. He presented a new idea in helping those children in abusive situations called the Watchful Shepherd Program. A unit, similar to those use to get help to the elderly, is placed in the home and the child is given a bracelet or pendant with an emergency button. If the button is pushed, the unit automatically begins to record what is happening in the home and an operator can speak to those in the home while rescue personnel is dispatched. Greene County has recently received 15 donated units, which cost \$500 each. They have not yet been placed in a Greene County home but will act as a deterrent against reoccurring abuse.

COLLEGE MAKES IMPROVEMENTS IN NURSING DEPARTMENT

Waynesburg College recently completed three new state-of-the-art classrooms in the nursing department. These classrooms are executive suite-type classrooms and one classroom is technology SMARTTM. This classroom features video conferencing capability and computer presentation connections.

"The rooms were designed with the adult learner in mind because they demand comfort and a creative learning environment," said Nursing Department Chair Patty Kraft. "The desks are gone and now we have work tables and comfortable chairs in a semi circle which will encourage a more facilitative process between instructor and students. Since 1997, our program has seen a 600% increase in adult nursing enrollments and we believe the market will continue to grow in this area. These classroom improvements will keep us on the technology edge of education."




